Founded in 1971, Starbucks Corporation is the premier and largest purveyor of coffee in the world.

Starbucks purchases and roasts high-quality whole bean coffees along with fresh, rich brewed coffees, Italian-style espresso, cold blended beverages, and a variety of complementary food items, sold through their retail stores. As of 2023, the multi-national chain has 38,038 locations in 80 countries worldwide with 16,255 locations in the United States. Currently, 51% of Starbucks locations are corporately operated with 49% of their locations operated by licensed operators. Starbucks saw strong revenue growth of 11% during 2022 when comparing 2021 largely attributed to 36% revenue growth from their licensed stores. Starbucks also increased their digital customer base during 2022, seeing a 15% Increase in their loyalty rewards memberships.

There are also several select "Starbucks Evenings" locations which offer beer, wine, and appetizers. Starbucks-brand coffee, ice cream, and bottled cold coffee drinks are also sold at grocery stores in the United States and other countries. In 2010, the company began its Starbucks Reserve program for single-origin coffees and high-end coffee shops.

# Starbucks Is Winning in 2023, and Its Stock Could Soar This Year

Starbucks (SBUX -1.23%) has found the magic formula for more than a good cup of coffee. It is getting customers back into its stores in droves, generating higher sales and profits. And it's expecting more of the same in the future.

Yet its stock is up only 3% so far this year, underperforming the market. Here's why that could change, and why now is a good time to buy.

Former CEO Howard Schultz came back last year to take over as **Starbucks** was experiencing pressure due to the pandemic. Although it was rebounding, it needed a **new growth strategy** as the world embraced new trends in **digital and artificial intelligence**. And as the company became even **bigger**, it also needed streamlining and **efficient growth plans**.

Starbucks stores were previously successful as a "third place," a meeting center for customers who wanted to hang out together outside of the home or office. But as more people work from home at least part of the time, trends have been moving toward coffee on the go with a focus on mobile orders and quick service.

Using Schultz's keen understanding of the business, along with company data and research, Starbucks has developed a **new growth strategy**. It uses technology to upgrade the **store experience** in **two distinct areas**: digital ordering and beverage customization.

So Starbucks is offering new store layouts **in large cities**, where office workers need a quick turnaround, and it's opening **more stores** in smaller cities to benefit from work-at-home trends. Meanwhile, delivery is demonstrating **strong growth**. All of this is a response to a shift from pre-pandemic behavior and is heavily dependent on a **strong digital backbone**.



### Starbucks Has Big Plans for Smalltown America

Starbucks has already dominated urban areas and the suburbs. Now, the chain has its sights set on smaller, rural communities.

Expanding in small towns "is a great move," said Bob Vergidis, a restaurant expert and executive with pointofsale.cloud, to The Food Institute. "Remember, post-pandemic mid-town business districts have become ghost towns. These small towns are markets waiting for new food and drink options.

Adding a Starbucks (in a small town) makes **total sense**, because this market offers a **reliable clientele** that's looking for inexpensive luxuries.

Starbucks officials feel America's small towns boast big potential.

We have an opportunity with regard to **net store growth** in the U.S.," CEO Laxman Narasimhan said during Starbucks' Q3 earnings call. There's real headroom for us to locate our stores where we see **customer growth**, smaller towns.

Starbucks, a chain ubiquitous in American cities, is targeting a new growth opportunity in small towns. The coffee giant's investors recently said there's "headroom" and opportunity in rural America as the chain is poised to overtake Subway's 20,000 domestic units to become the most prolific restaurant chain in the U.S.

Small, rural towns value community and Starbucks can do well if it **supports** and **engages** with the **local community**. Being a good neighbor will go a long way," Vergidis said.

In a statement sent to The Food Institute, Peter Saleh, managing director and restaurant analyst at BTIG, indicated Starbucks is **largely on solid financial footing** and has regained its pre-pandemic momentum due in part to **new store growth**.



# Conway City Council approves annexation of 1,700-acre development

Conway City Council on Tuesday afternoon unanimously approved the annexation and development of one of the largest proposed projects ever in the city.

The "Warden Station Tract" project will bring more than 1,700 acres near Pitch Landing Road and Highway 701 into the city.

The council approved the annexation in a first reading about **a month ago**, and the room was packed for **Tuesday's meeting**. During this recent meeting, not many people were there to speak against the project.

They have gathered together, they've worked really hard, they've been in contact with council members, and they just aren't really paying them a lot of attention and I think that they feel defeated, Jeanette Spurlock said.

The project is expected to bring a mix of about 3,300 multifamily, townhomes and single-family detached residences.

Developers said they are looking to build **affordable homes** in a **20-year timeline**, but it could be **sooner**.

Spurlock, who has lived in Horry County for **more than 30 years**, watched the meeting online and said she was shocked when she saw every council member's hand go up during voting.

The city has held multiple workshops and public hearings in recent months, but Spurlock said she still does not think enough planning and thought went into the decision.



# Leaders looking to diversify industry, build I-73 to lead Myrtle Beach area into future

While Horry County leaders acknowledge that the tourism industry helped develop the state's fastest-growing county, they are looking for strategic ways to diversify the local economy to attract higher-paying jobs.

Learning from the past, keeping graduates from moving away and upgrading infrastructure — including building an interstate — were discussed as solutions by a panel of five Horry County business and education leaders in Myrtle Beach during the 24th annual Economic Growth and Real Estate Summit hosted by Coastal Carolina University's Grant Center for Real Estate and Economics.

That growth boom has been historically fueled by the **Grand Strand tourism industry**, which by itself is only decades old.

Horry County, the home of popular tourist destination Myrtle Beach, was the nation's 24th-fastest growing in the past decade, according to U.S. Census data. The county added nearly 85,000 residents in that time as the population ballooned by close to one-third.

Michael King, chief executive of real estate firm KingOne Properties, moved to the area in the late 1970s with his family from Virginia when he was 11 years old. He said the tourism season back then was primarily limited to the summer months.


But the golf industry exploded along the Grand Strand in the 1980s, when as many as 125 courses opened along the 60-mile coastline from Georgetown County to the North Carolina state line. That gave way to added restaurants, stores and entertainment venues.

King said the result was more visitors during the typically slow spring and fall shoulder season, later **gaining popularity** with Canadians and visitors from out of state, who later came back and **purchased homes and condominiums**.
